### **Biographical Information**

Clark Kellogg has been a basketball commentator since 1987. In a career that has spanned over three decades, Clark has done radio and television broadcasting for the Indiana Pacers, Cleveland State University, the Atlantic 10 and Big East TV Networks, ESPN, Westwood One, and CBS Sports. At CBS, he has been a lead studio and game analyst since 1997, and a familiar and trusted voice during March Madness.

Clark attended The Ohio State University and earned his marketing degree in 1996. He excelled as a three-year starter on the basketball team from 1980-82, and as a junior he earned Big 10 MVP honors in 1982.

After his junior season, Clark was the 8<sup>th</sup> player selected in the 1982 NBA draft. He spent his entire 5 year playing career with the Indiana Pacers and was a unanimous 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Rookie selection and had career averages of 19ppg and 9rpg before his retirement in 1987 due to chronic knee issues.

Clark spent a total of thirty-two years with the Indiana Pacers. Five as a player, twenty-three as a broadcaster, and four as Vice President of Player Relations.

Serving and philanthropy are as much a part of Clark as basketball is. He uses his talent, time, and treasure to support various institutions and organizations. American Red Cross, Athletes in Action, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, One Heart Project, Ronald McDonald House Charities, The Ohio State University, and United Way to name several.

He also has served on The Ohio State Alumni Association Board, The Ohio State Board of Trustees (2010-19), and is a director on First Merchants Bank Regional Board.

Clark is a native of Cleveland Ohio. He and his bride Rosy have three adult children, two granddaughters, and live in Westerville Ohio.
