Professional Career

After participating in several NBA tryouts, Sommerville began his pro career with Atomeromu SE Paks in Hungary's A Division in 2006. Sommerville's contract in Hungary was bought out by Angers BC 49 in France's Pro B league and he debuted with 19 points and four rebounds Jan. 5, 2007. After completing the regular season with Angers BC 49, Sommerville finished his rookie pro season by helping Chalon to the semifinals of the French Pro A playoffs. He is currently playing in Argentina in the top league with Regatas Corrientes.

Bradley Career Summary

Originally signed with Iowa out of high school, but transferred to Southwestern Illinois College after being redshirted his freshman season in 2001-02. A first-team junior college All-American in his only season at Southwestern Illinois College, Sommerville signed with Bradley during the 2002 Early Signing Period and enjoyed a stellar three-year career (2003-06) at his hometown school. Sommerville averaged 16.2 points per game during his three-year Bradley career, the ninth-best scoring average in school history, and he finished 12th on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,493 points. He was the only Valley player to finish among the league's top five in both scoring and rebounding during each of his three seasons at Bradley. Sommerville finished fifth on Bradley's career list for 3-point field goals (153), He also became the first-ever Missouri Valley Conference player to record at least 600 rebounds (662) and 150 3-pointers during a 3-year period -- eighth player overall.
